This year, as we celebrate International Women's Day and launch our Women Build 2022 campaign, we invite our supporters to help us to #BreakTheBias in the housing sector.

Habitat's Women Build is an international campaign that has been engaging volunteers around the world since 1991 to support Habitat projects that empower women, children, and the disadvantaged living in poverty across the globe.

The intersection between inclusion and housing is a topic which is long overdue in Hong Kong. Ethnic minorities, single mothers and people with disabilities are faced with bias, discrimination, and other barriers to access safe, sanitary, and affordable housing.

This year, Habitat for Humanity Hong Kong is committed to #BreakTheBias and is excited to be partnering again with local NGOs, PathFinders and Mother's Choice, to improve much needed community facilities for vulnerable women and children in the city.

This year, we will renovate and redesign the PathFinders community centre in Tai Kok Tsui to provide a safe and welcoming environment for pregnant migrant domestic workers and their young children. We will also renovate the outside areas of Mother's Choice's Child Care Home, a temporary home for babies and children with special needs.

Our Women Build Ambassador, Ms Emily Lam Ho said: "I am committed to empowering women in Hong Kong to live their best life and I support the Habitat team as they scale up their efforts to address bias in the housing sector. Every woman deserves a decent home."
